mother used a very boring book to teach him. Then Matt



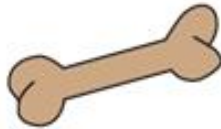

Attean arrived with a rabbit and sat down at the



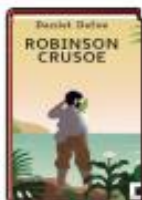
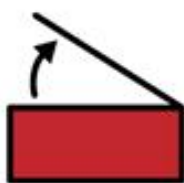
table. He did not say anything. He looked unhappy. With

Attean ignored Matt and looked at the wall. It felt

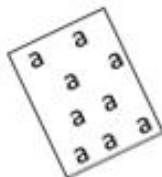


like forever. Then he surprised Matt and touched the

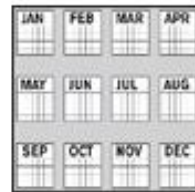

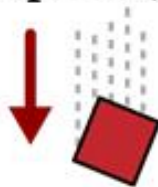

The next day Matt thought, "I hope the boy

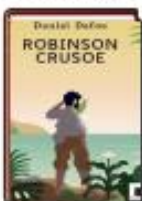


comes back." Soon Attean walked into the cabin. Matt
